Moggill Road Corridor Upgrade Project - Stage 1

February 2024 update – Moggill Road traffic switch (inbound)

WHAT WORKS ARE COMING UP?

Coming from the western suburbs you will notice significant traffic changes to Moggill Road from early March.

WHERE WILL THE WORKS BE?

Please see the map to show the upcoming traffic arrangements.

HOW MIGHT THIS WORK IMPACT ME?

Traffic Changes

- If you are heading towards Brisbane City (inbound) you must keep left after Station Road intersection.
- If you are planning to turn right into Coonan Street you must keep right after Station Road intersection.
- You will no longer be able to turn left towards the city at the temporary signalised intersection.
- Anyone who misses the turn off to the city will be able to U-turn at Belgrave Road and Allwood Street.
- For residents of the service road previously using Nelson Parade, access will now be via Moggill Road.
- There will be reduced speed limits, lane closures, changes to traffic flow and short-term traffic disruptions.

Construction impacts

- **Noise, dust and vibration:** noise and possible dust and vibration may be experienced from the construction activities.
- **Temporary lighting:** lighting towers are required to be used to light work areas at night to ensure worker safety.

Captain Roger Rusling;

Roger's 47 year nautical career has involved command and control of large container ships, offshore oil exploration, polar marine science and piloting in the complex waters of the Great Barrier Reef and Torres Strait.

After a routine career in container ships and the offshore oil industry Roger was involved in the planned salvage but subsequent scuttling of the Danish icebreaker "*Nella Dan*" at the sub Antarctic Macquarie Island,

Roger then spent 2 years training for the command of a marine science vessel in Antarctic service and was subsequently offered the first command of Australia's first true icebreaker, the "*RSV Aurora Australis*" working in Antarctic waters, both supplying the Australian bases with everything they need for survival and conducting marine research in the Great Southern and Antarctic Oceans

After leaving the "*Aurora Australis*" Roger made a career change and became a Great Barrier Reef marine pilot guiding over 980 large commercial ships through the reef, finishing as Chief Pilot modernising the recruiting, training and checking of the pilot group.

Roger retired in 2013 after a stint working as a regulator for the GBR pilotage industry with the *Australian Maritime Safety Authority* in Canberra, a city which is beautiful but much too far from the ocean.

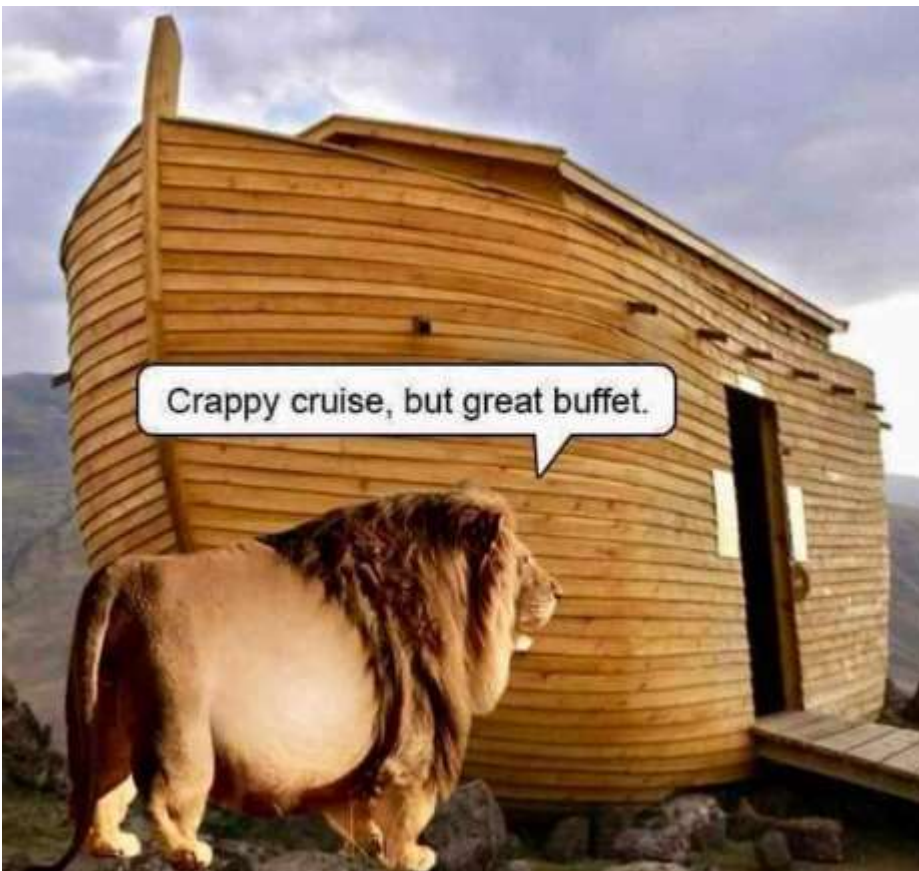
