### **Chisel sharpening training on the wet grinder**

The wet grinder for sharpening chisels and plane blades was one of the first items I bought for the Shed workshop but nobody seems to use it even though it is very simple to use so I am running a training session on Wednesday 22 November.

It is much easier and quicker to use the wet grinder than to use an oil-stone to sharpen a chisel and it produces consistent results when it is set up properly. The machine consists of an aluminium oxide wheel that rotates at a speed of 120 rpm in a water bath. This slow speed and the water bath mean that it is impossible to burn (ie overheat) the steel of the chisel. On the other side of the machine comprises a leather clad wheel for honing the ground chisel to a very sharp edge. The only tricky part of using the machine is setting it up to sharpen a chisel at the correct angle for chiselling hardwood or for chiselling softwood.

All will be explained and demonstrated on Wednesday morning (22 November) in the workshop from 9 am. Bring along a chisel that needs sharpening and learn how to keep your chisels in good nick.
